

## CREATED/PUBLISHED:

France : La Société Lumière, 1898-1899.

**SUMMARY:** Shorts document bullfights in Spain (Séville) and France (Béziers, Nîmes) during the late 19th century.

NOTES: These short films by the Lumière brothers depict two traditional events in Seville, Spain, as they appeared in the last years of the 19th century: Holy Week (Semana Santa) and bullfighting (la corrida de toros). The film that follows shows matadors fighting the bulls in the arena, assisted by an entourage of flagmen, sword pages, and lancers mounted on horseback, with cheering crowds in the background.
