## Part II: Classroom Activity Plan

Essential/Investigative Question: How do political parties become organized to win elections?

Objective(s): GOVT.6 The student will demonstrate knowledge of local, state, and national elections by

- a) describing the organization, role, and constituencies of political parties.
- b) describing the nomination and election process.

**Standard(s) Addressed:** VA Govt. 6a and 6b (see above)

This activity will be used after the class has been introduced to the basics of the political party system and election campaign process.

## Procedure(s):

- 1. Students will be divided into groups.
- 2. The images will be copied as well as projected on the whiteboard in the classroom.
- 3. The students will be given the primary source analysis link: http://www.loc.gov/teachers/primary-source-analysis-tool/
- 4. The groups will report/discuss their analysis.
- 5. A discussion/investigation will follow on how the cartons relate or do not relate to present day "party platform"; "soliciting votes"; and "party nominations."
