THE SIX ROLES OF THE PRESIDENT

ARTICLE II

The executive power shall be vested in a President of the United States of Emerica.

HEAD OF STATE

Head of the government and symbol of leadership, both to the American people and the world

COMMANDER IN CHIEF

Leader of the Armed Forces of the United States: Army, Navy, Air Force,
Coast Guard, and Marine Corps

CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Holds executive power and serves as "the boss" for Executive Branch government workers



AGENDA SETTER

Has the power to influence legislation and shape public policy, but remember: only Congress can legislate

KEEPER OF THE ECONOMY

Concerned with, and is generally held responsible for, the health of the American economy 5

PARTY CHIEF

Top ranking official of his/her political party and works to help other members get elected
