

#### **ALUMNI CAREER SURVEY**

#### Class of 2019

- 80% response rate; 9% higher than average response rate between 2016 and 2018
- 96% of respondents were employed or in graduate school within one year
  - 77% employed in their field or in graduate school
- Note: Employment totals for the Class of 2019 were collected in the spring and summer of 2020, when the COVID-19 pandemic began

#### Class of 2020

- 82% response rate; 11% higher than average response rate and 2% higher than Class of 2019 response
- 95% of respondents were employed or in graduate school within one year
  - 77% employed in their field or in graduate school

#### **REGISTERED STUDENTS**

115 Registered with the Disability Services Office

- 65 students received academic accommodations only
- 44 students received housing accommodations only (about 27 students received this last year)
  - Meal plan alternatives, ESA requests, and living environment needs included
- 15 students received both academic and housing accommodations

#### **TESTING CENTER**

69 students utilized the testing center

- Most granted accommodation in this area: 1.5x on exams and reduced distraction





The Academic Mentoring training course (at right) is available for all mentors. Through this course, mentors can access resources to best support students in the program.





#### Fall 2021

#### Spring 2022

- 339 confirmed appointments
- 617 appointments made

It is common for students to make appointments and change their mind later, so we only count the reported completed sessions as ones that we can confirm happened. There may be more sessions they were not scheduled through our online resource or situations where students completed a session without a report being turned in.

#### **TUTORING PROGRAM UPDATE: MIDTERM REFERRALS**

Traditionally, the Tutoring Center would wait for a student to be flagged in MUM before making contact about tutoring for a course they may be struggling in. However, this fall every student who received a D or F for a course on their midterm report was sent an email with their course code and a link to schedule tutoring. The goal was to make students aware of available tutoring sooner, and to be more prompt at reaching out to struggling students who may not be flagged otherwise. This was completed again in the spring semester.

#### **UPDATED TRAVEL POLICY**

#### **Key Points**

Keep Waynesburg Well Team approved travel policy, which includes guidance for domestic and international travel (relevant for study abroad, service office, and other campus travel)

- Students can travel abroad to countries listed as a level "1" or "2" by the U.S. Department of State\*
- Students traveling independently will be required to follow vaccine and testing requirements set by destination/program of choice
- International students may be unable to be vaccinated in advance of travel; those who have not been vaccinated must quarantine following travel (based on the CDC guidance)

As a result of this updated policy and limited international study opportunities, students who travel through domestic programs (like The Washington Center) can apply their institutional financial aid
